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Headteacher's Notices

Welcome back to the new academic year after the long summer break. I trust you all had an enjoyable holiday and it was lovely to see our children return to school on Wednesday looking smart, happy and ready for the term ahead. All of the children I have spoken to have had a story to tell about the many wonderful and exciting experiences they have taken part in during the summer break. The wonderful holiday diaries some children kept and the recount writing in children's books this week about their holiday experiences also reflects this.

We have had a busy summer holiday in school too as we prepared for the new term. There has been no significant building work taking place this summer; but Mr Sparks, our Caretaker, has been hard at work painting, cleaning and repairing things across the school site. Teachers and Teaching Assistants have also been busy preparing for the new National Curriculum for Key Stages 1 and 2 that came into effect on 1st September 2014. The new curriculum sets out statutory guidance for schools on what children have to learn and when during their time in primary school. Within this document there has been some big changes; with new learning added, other concepts being removed and a greater level of challenge provided in all subjects. School staff have viewed this as a great opportunity to review what we currently offer and make it even better for our children than it was before! We are all really looking forward to the many exciting learning opportunities that the new curriculum will bring throughout the coming term. With next week's newsletter you will each receive a curriculum overview sheet that outlines the learning that will be taking place in classes over the coming half term and should you wish to discuss any aspect of our curriculum, please do not hesitate to get in touch with me at school.

With the start of the new term, can I remind parents/ carers that Breakfast Club operates every weekday morning from 8am until school opens to children at 8.55am. Breakfast Club costs only £1.50 per session and children have a range of structured activities to take part in on a weekly rotation along with a great choice of food on a morning. Nursery children are more than welcome to attend and there is no need to book children into Breakfast Club; simply turn up to the sessions that you require. Our After School Club is also available every day from 3.05pm to 4.30pm for those requiring after school care for their children. Please see Mrs Campbell in the school office if you are interested in accessing this provision.

Like last year, we have a range of after school activities planned for children to take part in and once again we are able to offer these FREE OF CHARGE to all children who wish to take part. Next week sees the start of Homework Club, Key Stage 2 Football, and Tag Rugby to name but a few. Attached to today's newsletter is a form for you to complete and return to school if your child would like to take part in any of our after school clubs. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.

Could I kindly remind parents / carers that the school gates open at 8.45am and unfortunately no one is allowed on site before this time as we cannot guarantee the supervision and safety of your children. From 8.45am, children can access school via the playgrounds and parents can escort their younger children to the Nursery, Reception and Year 1/2 classrooms. We would however, like to encourage our younger children in Year 1/2 to come into school independently from the main school gate and would appreciate if parents can work with us towards this goal in the coming weeks. At 8.55am the side entrance gate will be closed and children arriving after this time will have to enter school through the main entrance. We are very keen to promote good attendance at school and ensure all children are on site for the start of the school day. I am sure you will support us in this.

Finally, attached today is a change of contact details sheet. Please complete this if you have recently moved house, changed phone numbers etc and not informed us. Particularly with regard to phone numbers, it is absolutely crucial that we have working telephone numbers on file in school so that we can phone or text you in the event that your child is poorly or we need to let you know of something urgently. Thank you for your support with this.

All of the school staff look forward to working with you and your children over the next academic year and if you have any concerns or issues you wish to raise, please do not hesitate to get in touch

Notices and Reminders

Absence During Term Time Requests:

As you will be aware, Government regulations removed the right for a child to be absent from school for holidays during term time. We would like to remind parents of this but also that they may submit a Request For Absence During Term Form should there be exceptional circumstances they would like the school to consider.

Parking:

May we again politely request that parents park with consideration and with safety in mind when they drop off and collect their children each day. School Street gets very busy at these times and we encourage parents / pupils who live in the village to consider walking to school or if having to travel by car, finding a parking space in nearby streets or on Hargill Road. We have been informed that checks are likely to be carried out and people may receive warnings or fines for parking inappropriately. Your co-operation with this would be greatly appreciated.

School Uniform/ Pupil Appearance:

It was lovely to see everyone looking so smart and ready for work in their uniforms on Wednesday morning. If you wish to order any uniform throughout this academic year, order forms are available from the school office or can be downloaded from our website. A polite reminder regarding haircuts - we have noticed a number of boys sporting haircuts which include patterns, swirls and shavings which continue to be commented on by many children. We do not encourage children to have haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children and would appreciate if parents could bear this in mind when children next have their hair cut.. With regard to jewellery, only a wrist watch is allowed to be worn by children. Other jewellery such as earrings, bracelets etc are not permitted and should be removed at home.

Safeguarding:

We would like to remind visitors of our policy that they turn off and do not access their phones whilst they are in the school building. May we also remind parents that they should enter the building through the main school entrance and not through the Key Stage 1 or 2 doors which only children and staff should use. This will ensure that no unauthorised person may enter the building and will keep everyone safe. Children unfortunately are not able to open the main entrance door for anyone. If a child sees you waiting at the main entrance and no adult is in the office, they will inform an adult. They are not being rude, simply following what they have been asked to do.

Year 6 SATs:

The Year 6 SATs will be held the week beginning Monday 11 May 2015. It is very important that all Year 6 children have an excellent attendance prior to the tests and are present in school for the whole period as these tests are national tests and cannot be taken at any other time. The school will not authorise any request for absence for Year 6 children from Monday 13 April 2015 when we return after the Easter holidays regardless of the circumstances until after testing has been completed.

Parent Helpers:

If anyone has an hour or two spare on a morning or afternoon we would be grateful of any offers of classroom help. Please speak to your child's class teacher if you are interested. As you will be aware, all new helpers must undergo an enhanced DBS Records check which we hope will not put anyone off!

Money:

Please send any money to school in a sealed envelope with your child's name, class and reason for the money written on the outside. This helps overcome any confusion which might arise. Also, always ensure you hand money to Mrs Campbell or Miss Tray in the school office as money simply left at the hatch of the school office cannot guarantee to be accounted for.
